Heed flood warnings and road closures.


Always drive within the speed limit.

Check headlights are clean and working well.

Inflate tires and check tread wear.

Inspect wipers; replace if needed!





Be sure rear and brake lights are working properly so that your vehicle is visible in wet weather conditions.

If visibility is poor, pull over!

Cruise control can cause you to lose control. Best not to use in wet weather.

Be aware of road conditions such as potholes, uneven surfaces, or poorly marked roads. Be alert of animals crossing the road unexpectedly in areas with no proper fencing.

Keep calm and do not engage with aggressive drivers, never confront.

Roadworks can create obstacles, detours and changes in normal traffic patterns that increase the risk of accidents.

Faulty traffic lights can create confusion resulting in collisions.

Be mindful of pedestrians walking or crossing the roads. Cyclists can be less visible, maintain a safe distance.

Be extra careful in urban areas, as incidents of hijacking and smash and grab thefts are high.
