SIGNS & SYMPTOMS

(You can have early colorectal cancer without symptoms.)

- Change in bowel habits.
- A feeling that the bowel doesn't empty completely.
- Rectal bleeding.
- Stomach pain.
- Weakness.
- Unexplained weight loss.
- Family history of colon cancer.

TREATMENT & REDUCE YOUR PROGNOSIS CANCER RISK:

- Treatment depends on how far the cancer has advanced.
- Treatment may include surgery, radiation, chemotherapy, or a combination of these therapies.
- Go for cancer screenings.
- Eat a healthy diet.
- Exercise regularly.
- Maintain a healthy weight.
- Do not smoke.
- Avoid alcohol.

SCREENING

 Go for regular colon screening tests such as a colonoscopy or a sigmoidoscopy from age 50.
