About Rehlahleng Special School – Eastern Limb Region

- Rehlahleng is a Public Government School in the Sekhukhune Region, in the community of Ga Mampuru in the Limpopo Province.
- The school is managed by School Principal, Mrs Nomonde Bhembe.
- Rehlahleng is a Special School catering for children with Down Syndrome and special needs.
- The school currently houses 209 children, with ages ranging from seven to 30 years old. The school has twelve teachers, twelve general workers, a Social Worker, and a Professional Nurse. The children receive lessons in food production (cooking), sewing, fine art, gardening, welding, carpentry, and hat making.

- Sizabantu Upliftment Centre is a registered entity which serves as a community-based centre. It is situated in Tlhabane, near Rustenburg in the North West Province.
- The centre is managed by Ms Violet Kgomotso Setshedi and she currently has eight employees.
- The centre currently caters for a total of 63 people, from children aged five months to adults aged 60 years of age.
- The facility provides proper healthcare, social support, and training to strengthen them for orphans, vulnerable children, individually abused family members victims, young adults, or women, as well as pregnant teenagers.

- The facility currently houses 39 people: two children, two young adults aged between 16 and 18 years; 19 elderly women and 16 elderly men.
